CCWT is currently hiring two researchers to play key roles in the growing College Internship Study at UW-Madison

The Center for Research on College-Workforce Transitions (CCWT) is an applied research Center at UW-Madison's School of Education that is focused on improving the quality and accessibility of college-workforce pathways for all college and university students. As part of our mission, we have launched a longitudinal, mixed methods study – the College Internship Study – that aims to improve the field of higher education and experiential learning's understanding of which students are taking internships (and who is not), specific barriers to internship participation, the format of these programs, and subsequent impacts on student vocational identity and labor market outcomes. As part of this project, we work closely with institutional partners to answer questions they deem essential, and provide them with high-quality technical reports tailored to their unique situations and interests.

The College Internship Study is now growing and CCWT is seeking two talented scholars – one qualitative researcher and one quantitative researcher - to join our team! As our study grows and involves Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) and Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs), we seek researchers who have a working knowledge of and appreciation for these institutions and their students.

Specifically, we are seeking applicants with the following qualifications:

- A PhD in education, sociology, anthropology, psychology, or economics;
- Strong working knowledge of either qualitative or quantitative research methods (mixed methods expertise is a plus!);
- A strong working knowledge of theory and the literature in fields such as the sociology of education, vocational psychology, educational anthropology, experiential and work-based learning, or labor economics;
- 2-3 years professional experience with independently conducting academic research;
- Demonstrated ability to write for multiple audiences including scholarly journals, policymakers, and the general public;
- Proven experience juggling multiple projects, deadlines, and tasks; and,
- A good team-player with strong communication skills, ability to learn and grow, and be creative and innovative.
